Class routines:

Reading books

Design and Technology

_We are going to be developing our sewing skills this half term. We will learn the different types of stitches and then put this into practice to join two pieces of materials.

Geography

This half term we will develop our knowledge on where we live. We will be using aerial photos and maps to study our local area and identify the human and physical features.

PE:

This half-term our PE day is **Tuesday**. Our focus in dance and we will be looking at movement, expression and shape.

Music:

This half-term we will learning to sing our nativity songs from memory for an audience.

Autumn 2 – Hazel Class

Computing:

This half-term children will practice and develop their laptop skills and learn how to use Microsoft word. We will focus on how to use the different features of word and then apply these to write about ourselves.

English:

This half-term we will be focusing on our class nativity 'Baubles'. We will be exploring the script and becoming familiar with the story. We will compare the layout of our script to a story to help us understand how to read a script. Then we will delve into the different characters and understanding their personalities.

Mathematics:

This half-term all pupils will begin looking at calculations within twenty. We will start by looking at adding three 1-digit numbers and learn how to make efficient choices when deciding in what order to add the three addends.

Religious Education:

This half-term we are learning about why Jesus is special to Christmas. We will learn about the nativity story how some Christians believes Jesus was a special baby.

Science:
