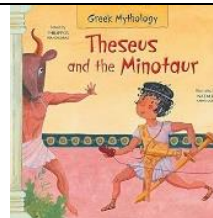

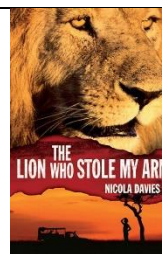

- 1) Times tables – by the end of year 4, it is expected that all children know all their times tables up to x12.
