In English we are exploring the works of Charles Dickens with a particular focus on Oliver Twist. Create a new book cover for the book and write a detailed blurb on the back.



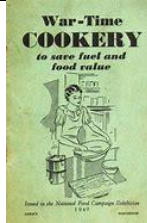
As part of our work on health and wellbeing create a mindfulness meditation we could use in class. Think about the ones we have already explored and create one of your own that we could use.

As well as the above, the following homework should be done every week:

- 1) Times tables – by the end of year 4, it is expected that all children know all their times tables up to x12.

- 3) Reading – this can be your home/ school reader, a library book, a magazine or comic or something else that you enjoy reading. Keep reading – it will also help you with your writing.
