Welcome back to our last term in Reception.

Our topic for the next half term will be Growth and Change We will be reading The Enormous Turnip, The Hungry Caterpillar and Handa's Surprise.

This term, we will continue with our phonics learning. We are coming up to the end of phase 3 and will begin to review these sounds and ensure children are secure in their application of the sounds before moving on to phase 4. Attached is a sound and tricky word mat to help your child at home. They need to recognise these sounds and then blend them and spell them in words eq n. igh. to night

In maths we will be concentrating on taking away and sharing and doubling numbers, We will be continuing to explore the concept 1 more/less as well recalling number bonds to 5 1+4=5, 2+3=5, 3+2=5, 4+1=5, 5+0=5

Each week I will add a news item onto Class Dojo showing you some of the exciting things we have been up to and how you can further help your child at home.

In topic we are looking at the life cycle of a butterfly and finding out about different fruits and how to make a fruit kebab.
